// C-130 “Fat Albert” Pilot

Captain Jackson Streiff is a native of Omaha, Nebraska. He graduated from Millard South High School in 2010, where he played varsity football. In 2014, he graduated from the University of Nebraska Lincoln with a Bachelor's of Science in Criminal Justice. Upon graduation he earned a commission as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps through the Platoon Leaders Course program and reported to The Basic School aboard Marine Corps Base Quantico, Virginia.

In May 2015, Jackson reported to Naval Air Station (NAS) Pensacola, Florida to begin aviation indoctrination. Upon completion of Primary flight training in the T-6B Texan II with VT-2 at NAS Whiting Field in Milton Florida, Jackson selected the KC-130J as his fleet platform. He completed Advanced Flight training in the T-44C Pegasus while assigned to VT-31 at NAS Corpus Christi, Texas. Jackson earned his wings of gold in March 2017 and reported to the Fleet Replacement Detachment East at Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Cherry Point, North Carolina for initial training and qualification as a KC-130J pilot.

In January of 2018 Jackson then reported to Marine Aerial Refueler Transport Squadron 152 “Sumos” at Marine Corps Air Station Iwakuni, Japan where he served as the Intelligence Officer in Charge, Flight Duty Officer, and Mission Planning Officer in Charge. He also served as a squadron detachment planner for Exercise Cobra Gold and was detached to several countries throughout the Pacific and Southeast Asia.

Captain Streiff has accumulated more than 900 flight hours over the course of multiple joint, bilateral, and multilateral exercises in the Pacific area of responsibility, and has received various personal and unit awards.
